She has returned for a second extensive tour, teaching the dances of Romania at workshops and camps.

OGLEBAY PARK

Oglebay is one of America's finest municipal parks with an expanding and varied cultural, educational, and recreational program. Oglebay Institute, utilizing the facilities in Oglebay Park, sponsors and directs classes and workshops in the fine arts, crafts, nature, theatre arts, folk arts and music; and special lectures and exhibits in the fields of religion, travel, antique appreciation, and art. Camping programs are provided for folk dancing, nature study, music, and twirling and drum majoring.

FACILITIES

Facilities of Camp Russel provide ample sleeping space in dorm-like cabins. There are just a few accommodations for families to stay together. Supervision of children is the responsibility of parents. Teens, unless accompanied by an adult, should check in and out with the camp director. Oglebay Park has facilities for swimming, tennis, golf, riding, fishing, and boating.

WHAT TO BRING

Bring your own bedding plus a pillow if you need one. A few bedding sets may be rented for \$1.00 per night. Please request bedding in advance. Also bring comfortable dance clothes, lowheeled shoes, costumes, and a flashlight. Raincoats can be useful.
