

SECOND REGULAR MEETING OF MIAMI VALLEY FOLK DANCE COUNCIL

March 10, 1981

PLACE: Home of John Pappas - 7:30 p.m.

ATTENDING: Peggy Booher, John Pappas, Sam Ballinger, and Marjorie Darragh

The meeting was called to order. Secretary's minutes were approved as submitted.

The Treasurer reported we had \$1,289.70 on hand the end of February, and \$1,580.84 as of March 10, after bills were paid and receipts for dues, weekend etc.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Frank Hart made a holder in which to place cards with the names of dances taught on Ethnic Sundays and also Thursday evenings. Sam will look into making a blackboard which would be easier to use than the holder and card system.
2. Dances to be taught by our club at Tri-City have not been finalized; however, Carolyn Stovall will teach Mt. Spring Song, Vera Fisher - The Weaver's Dance, Charlie Castellano has not decided on the dance he will teach. We may have Cyt Cyt taught.  
After we find out the prices to be charged for Tri-City, Council will decide how much our club will pay toward our members attending.
3. Vera Fisher has a confirmation from Mae Fraley that she will conduct our spring workshop for 1982 at a fee of \$50.00 per session. Mae plans to drive because of high plane fares. The date has not been finalized.
4. Council decided to postpone making definite plans for the 1982 fall workshop until after our Dennis Boxell workshop.
5. Liability Insurance was again discussed and it was decided to drop the matter as that is what the Miami Valley Dance Council did also.
6. Sam suggested we add one item to our "General Guidelines for Workshop Chairman" in the sending out of our letters. We must be sure to ask for the money for the meal to be send in with the reservation.
7. John reported the syllabus has been printed and collated. It only needs a cover and to be stapled.
8. Peggy reported Vera Pacey is retiring. Nancy and Lou Hyll attended a luncheon in her honor and represented our club.
9. Harry Khamis requested membership after having attended 20 sessions. It was unanimously approved by Council members present, and Peggy later checked with Tony VanDer Sluijs, who was absent, and he agreed Harry should be approved for membership having attended 20 regular programs.
10. Program Committee reported plans for Ethnic Sundays as follows:  
March was Italian, April - Balkan, May - Polish, June - English, July - American, August - International, Sept. not decided, October - Israeli, November - International, and December not decided.

NEW BUSINESS: Jeanne Gulden submitted a proposal for buying a tape recorder for the club. It was decided to appoint her to check prices and report.

A short meeting will be held March 26 at Solomon Pavilion to evaluate the weekend and set date for next regular meeting. (7:00 p.m.)
