

ANNUAL MEETING OF MIAMI VALLEY FOLK DANCERS

The annual meeting of the Miami Valley Folk Dancers was held at 3:00 o'clock, January 11, 1987, at Solomon Pavilion. Thirty-one members attended. John Pappas, Chairman, called the meeting to order. Secretary's minutes were approved as read. Treasurer's report was approved as submitted; it had been audited by Pat Hennessey.

April 17 - North German miniworkshop with Wilfred Knorr. Income was \$79.00, expenses were \$153.00.

May 1 - Romanian miniworkshop with Nicholas Hilferink. Income was \$70.00, expenses were \$153.00.

May 22 - Open House, which was not as successful as the year before.

Aug. 14 - Turkish miniworkshop with Ercument Kilic. Income was \$67.00, expenses were \$133.39.
