



- LEADER: Erik Bendix has been teaching folkdance in both Europe and America since 1972. He has directed and choreographed for a variety of dance ensembles. His dance interests span Chinese martial arts, Mevlevi dervish whirling, Balkan village dance, and the nearly lost traditions of Yiddish dance.
- ❖ SCHEDULE: Erik's workshop will have three teaching sessions and a review session. The Saturday evening party will be an unusual treat – it will be held jointly with the South Slavic Club (at the Czech Club – directions supplied), with live music and delicious ethnic dinner/desserts! (And no smoking, these days.)
 - **Saturday**: There will be **two teaching sessions**. Armenian dances will be taught beginning at 10 AM, and Greek dances beginning at 2:30 PM. (Lunch will be on your own, at 1 PM.) The Saturday evening dance party will be held at 922 Valley Street. Dinner will be available at 7 PM, and Veseli will play beginning at 8 PM. Erik will review dances between the band's sets.
 - Sunday: The teaching session, on dances of Albania, will start at 10 AM. The lunch break will start at noon, and the afternoon review session will run 1 to 4 PM.
